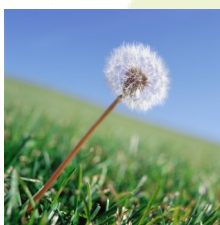
*Instead of dwelling the '...if only Sophie had found Prahran Mission...' I decided on a better and more long term approach for the future.*
